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ABOUT YA'S ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE PROGRAMS Young Audiences artist-in-residence programs

engage students in creative experiences through a series of in-depth visits from a YA teaching artist who works alongside teachers and students. All YA residencies are skills- and curriculum-based. Many residencies are also arts-integrated, connecting skills and concepts in the arts with those in literacy, math, science, and history. These programs are led by artists that have received training from the Teaching Artist Institute (TAI) and can be custom-designed to meet the specific needs of your students. Residencies are tailored to your needs but usually include:

- A kick-off assembly (for performing arts only) An orientation meeting and planning session • A set of workshops for classes of up to 25 students each
- A student culminating or sharing event An evaluation meeting

ABOUT MSAC AIE GRANT FUNDING

The Maryland State Arts Council's (MSAC) Arts in Education (AiE) initiative is designed to promote, strengthen, and enhance the arts and arts education in Maryland's elementary and secondary schools, and through its Artist-in-Residence (AiR) program, MSAC provides a number of teaching artist residency grants to eligible Maryland schools. The MSAC AiE grant will fund up to 30% of the total cost of a Young Audiences residency program, including travel costs.
